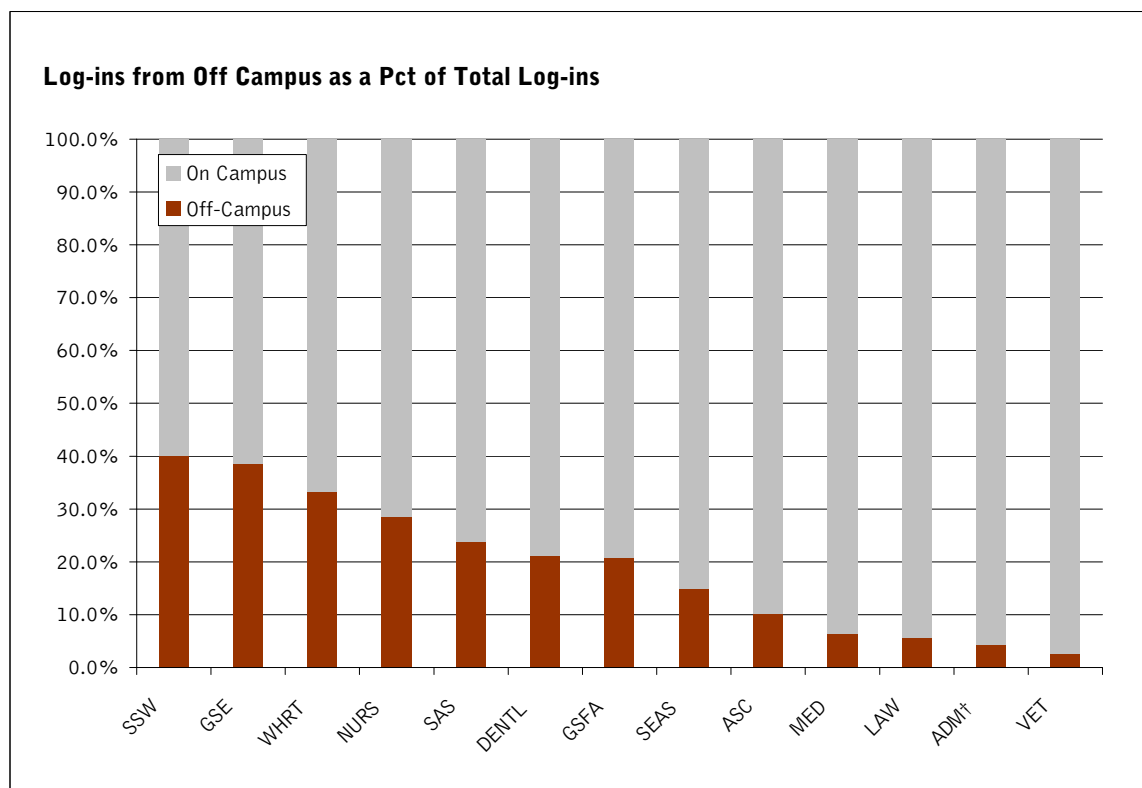

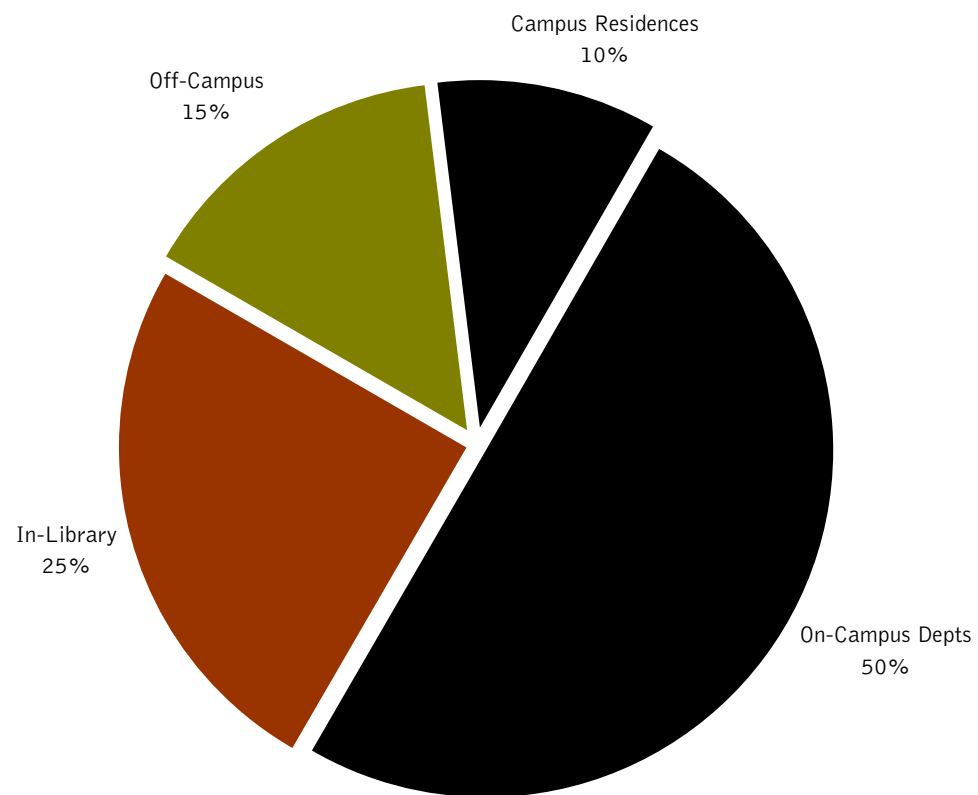

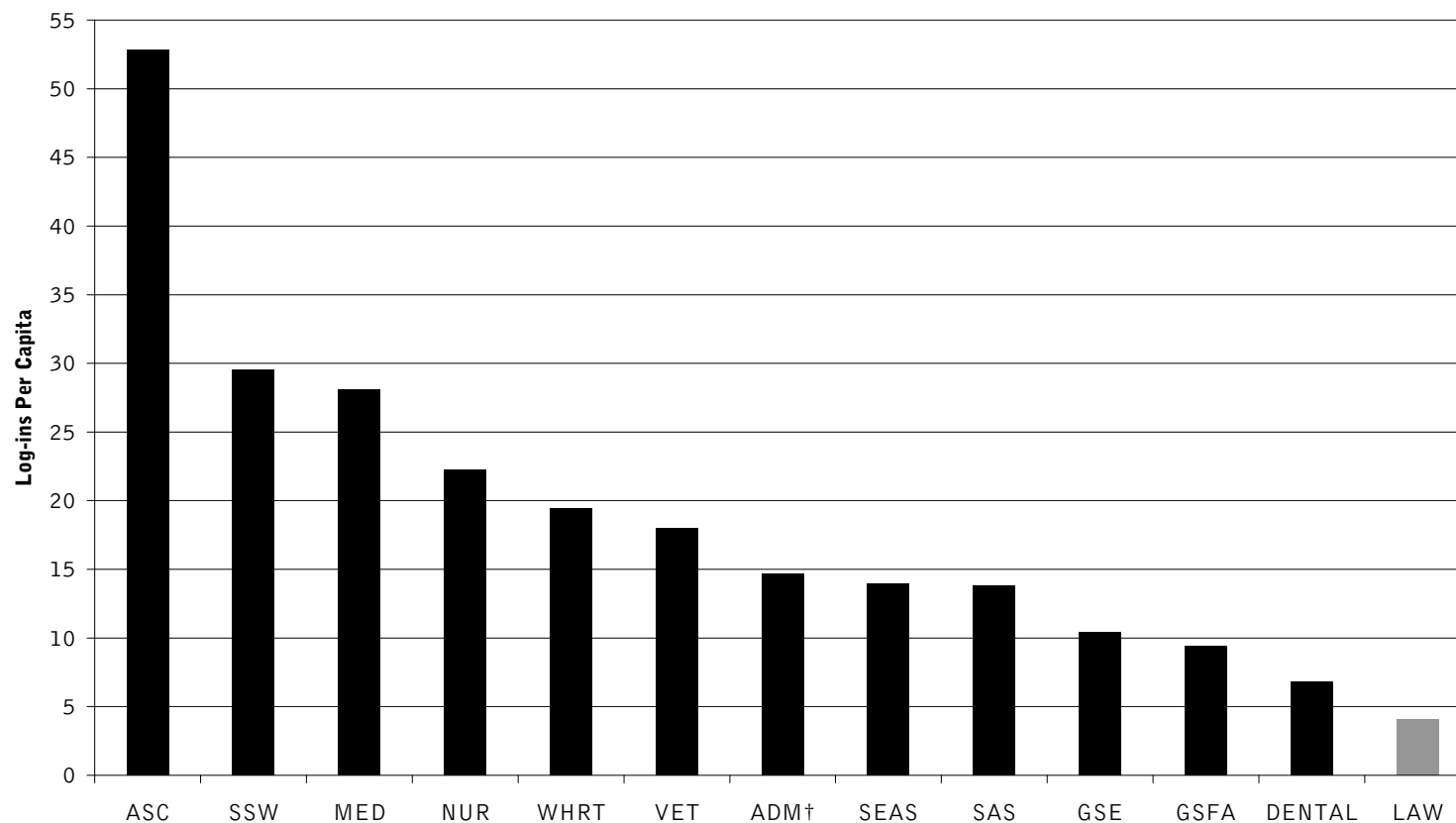
Where Do Library Users Access Information Bases and E-Journals?
